

Boni Sones OBE has had a 40 year career in journalism in the field of media, government, and politics and now specialise in web broadcasting on issues of global significance.

She has worked in print, Radio and TV journalism and been a correspondent and editor for the BBC. Today she reports and broadcast within academia on economics, business, innovation, and technological change in the digital age. One day a week she goes to Westminster to report on women MPs in British politics and public policy for her www.parliamentaryradio.com.

She has written three books on the work of women MPs, the latest published in March 2018 called: "When There's a Woman in the Room – Part Two". All her books can be found in the National Libraries of Britain: The British Library, the Bodleian Library Oxford University, The Cambridge University Library, National Library of Scotland, National Library of Wales and Trinity College Dublin.

Working with a team of other broadcast journalists from the East including Jackie Ashley, Deobrah McGurran and Linda Fairbrother, she has also set up three national audio archives of all the interviews they have as a small team conducted over the past 12 years. These are housed at the British Library, the London School of Economics and the latest at the History of Parliament Trust. Her work has reflected the themes of the #Vote100 celebrations in Parliament this year.

In 2009 she was awarded an OBE for services to broadcasting and PR.
